If You Like Whodunits, You'll Enjoy The 39 Steps

If you enjoy murder mysteries and theater performances that aren't too deep or serious, you'll probably enjoy the quirky show, *The 39 Steps*, which will be at the Lone Tree Arts Center April 2 through April 11, 2015.

Described as Hitchcock meets hilarious, the play features just four cast members who play more than 100 roles in a fast-paced whodunit. In addition to the zany characters, the Tony Award-winning show is packed with laughs, an on-stage plane crash, handcuffs, missing fingers and romance.

The story revolves around a man with a boring life, who meets a woman with a thick accent who says she's a spy. When he takes her home, she is murdered. Soon, a mysterious organization called "The 39 Steps" is hot on the man's trail in a nationwide manhunt that climaxes in a death-defying finale.

Adapted by Patrick Barlow from the novel by John Buchan from the movie of Alfred Hitchcock, *The 39 Steps* is performed by just four cast members. In Lone Tree, those performers will be:
