The Town of Parker is back among the best small cities or towns to live in the U.S. WalletHub.Com recently announced its ranking of the Town as #19 on its list of "Best Small Cities in America" for 2015.

"And from a purely financial standpoint, living in a small city creates a sense of greater wealth because of cheaper cost of living — one of the main draws for in-movers, especially those seeking to raise a family.

According to WalletHub, life in a small city demands some tradeoffs such as shorter business hours, a heavier reliance on cars and fewer dating opportunities," so WalletHub's analysts wanted to find the best small cities where "residents don't have to give up much."

We don't feel like we are giving up much of anything to live in this great Denver suburb, which offers everything from great schools and recreational facilities to close proximity to the Rocky Mountains.
